March, 2014 - HCH began a Community Health Works Round Table. Participants from HCH, Harrison County Health Department, various home health companies and nursing homes that serve the community, the HC YMCA, local clinics, assisted living centers, hospices, VA benefits counselors, and other pertinent community resource representatives from Harrison County & Crawford County IN and Meade County KY. This community health cooordination group is working to compile a list of known resources and services and is currently meeting bi-monthly to educate the Community about and coordinate various health services/programs.

March 2014 - HCH created an internal Communications/PR committee to coordinate efforts to better educate the community on various Hospital resources and programs. These communications include information about the Hospital's Medical Staff members, services, wellness and health prevention programs, and other pertinent health information.
